Discounted Health Exam – Use within 10 days of adoption

Congratulations on adopting a new companion animal! We want you and your new family member to establish a relationship with a veterinarian as soon as possible. This form is good for one discounted health examination (value of \$22 at HSHV). The Humane Society of Huron Valley offers a full service veterinary clinic for adopters and the public. Please read and initial below:

- _____ Although we make every effort to give the best treatment possible to each animal while it is in our care, we cannot guarantee the health of any animal that we place for adoption nor that all possible diseases are known at time of adoption. Please be aware that animals can also carry diseases that are transferable between animals and humans. Please see your physician if you have any concerns or have immune-compromised household members.

- _____ Emergencies that arise post adoption are the responsibility of the adopter. HSHV does NOT reimburse for veterinary fees incurred. However, we do suggest that you call the HSHV clinic for care if an emergency happens during business hours, as we may be able to assist you at a lower cost.

- _____ All health concerns and care post-adoption are considered the responsibility of the adopter, including vaccinations, de-worming, testing, and monthly preventative medicine.

- _____ Because animals in boarding or kennel facilities are more susceptible to catching many common illnesses, the HSHV Veterinary Clinic offers medications for these conditions at a discounted rate during the first 10-days post-adoption with the discounted health exam.

- _____ We use de-worming medication on every animal in our facility, but this does not protect against every parasite, including ear mites, tapeworms, etc. We recommend fecal testing at the time of your first veterinary visit (\$24 standard fee, if done at HSHV).

- _____ Animals have received vaccinations, prescribed medications, testing, and preventative up until the date of adoption. This means your pet may likely require further treatments and tests. Please consult with your veterinarian to receive a personalized vaccination and treatment schedule for your new pet.

- _____ All of our adult cats up for adoption have been tested for FIV and Feline Leukemia. Kittens under 4 months of age are tested for Feline Leukemia only, as the FIV test for kittens has little validity until the kitten is at least 4-6 months of age. Unfortunately these tests are never 100% accurate, and it is recommended that you follow up with your veterinarian to determine additional testing needs.

- _____ HSHV encourages you to participate in the 24PetWatch Insurance Gift of pet health insurance, as your pet may be eligible for benefits according to the restrictions applied by 24PetWatch. We are not responsible for any decisions on claim submittals.
