## Half-off Health Exam for Adopters Use within 10 days of adoption

Congratulations on adopting a new companion animal! We want you and your new family member to establish a relationship with a veterinarian as soon as possible. HSHV offers an affordable, full-service veterinary clinic for adopters and the public, and all fees collected go back into helping animals in the shelter! **This form is good for half off your pet's first health examination fee (value up to \$25) at the Humane Society of Huron Valley Veterinary Clinic within 10 days of adoption. To make an appointment, call 734-662-4365.**

Please read and initial below:

- \_\_\_ Although we make every effort to give the best treatment possible to each animal while it is in our care, we cannot guarantee the health of any animal that we place for adoption nor that all possible diseases are known at time of adoption. Please be aware that animals can also carry diseases that are transferable between animals and humans. Please see your physician if you have any concerns or have immune-compromised household members.
- \_\_\_ Emergencies that arise post-adoption are the responsibility of the adopter. HSHV does NOT reimburse for veterinary fees incurred. However, we do suggest you call the HSHV clinic for care if an emergency happens during business hours, as we may be able to assist you.
- \_\_\_ Animals have received necessary vaccinations, medications, testing and preventative up until the date of adoption. This means your pet may likely require further vaccinations, treatments and tests. Please consult with your vet to receive a personalized vaccination and treatment schedule for your new pet.
- \_\_\_ All of our adult cats up for adoption have been tested for FIV and Feline Leukemia. Kittens under 4 months old are tested for Feline Leukemia only, as the FIV test has little validity until the kitten is 4-6 months of age. Unfortunately these tests are never 100% accurate, and it is recommended you follow up with your veterinarian to determine additional testing needs.
- \_\_\_ All post-adoption health concerns and care are considered the responsibility of the adopter, including vaccinations, de-worming, testing, and monthly preventative medicine.
- \_\_\_ Some illnesses are common in boarding, kennel and shelter environments. If your pet develops symptoms of one of these illnesses due to the shelter environment, the HSHV Veterinary Clinic may offer treatment medications at a discounted rate during the first 10-days post-adoption, together with the discounted health exam.
- \_\_\_ We use de-worming medication on every animal in our facility, but this does not protect against every parasite, including ear mites, tapeworms, etc. We recommend fecal testing at the time of your first veterinary visit (\$22-25 standard fee applies). If you elect this option, please bring a fresh stool sample with you to your post-adoption exam.
- \_\_\_ HSHV encourages you to participate in the 24PetWatch Insurance Gift of pet health insurance, as your pet may be eligible for benefits according to the restrictions applied by 24PetWatch. We are not responsible for any decisions on claim submittals.
